PRAYER OF CONFESSION (FORM 2)

Worship Leader: In the spirit of Lent, let's ask for forgiveness praying together:

Psalm 51

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy, blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.

For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

Against you, you alone, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment. Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me.

You desire truth in the inward being therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart.

Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice.

Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.

in some places overcrowding its buildings, in others battling to maintain services,

or in some countries meeting secretly behind locked doors.

Congregation: Hear their prayers, dear Lord, and make us instruments of your peace.

Worship Leader: We look on the faces of both friends and enemies, O God.

Some of our friends are doing it hard, while enemies seem to be getting it

easy; yet all are souls for whom Christ died.

Congregation: Hear their prayers, dear Lord, and make us instruments of your peace.

Worship Leader: (read memorials, birthdays, prayer list from bulletin)

Congregation to add their petitions and thanksgivings, followed by Silence.

you have been busy answering our petitions
